

Global Education Coalition Third annual meeting



Background

Three years ago, the Global Education Coalition was **born out of a crisis**. Crises of many kinds – educational, environmental, energy, economic – continue to disrupt and curtail efforts to achieve universal access to quality education by 2030. Today in 2023, the Coalition has demonstrated its ability to swiftly respond to education challenges and crises, mobilizing the resources, expertise, and experience of its 208 members.

At its three-year anniversary, the Global Education Coalition (GEC) will demonstrate the commitment, competence, and cooperative methodology that makes it an important multistakeholder catalyst for innovation and transformation in education. Governments around the world are increasingly looking for modern ways to tackle the persistent problems that have plagued education systems since long before the pandemic. The GEC's diverse range of partners — which include multilateral organizations, the private sector, civil society, and the news media — can respond to the critical needs of governments and help them both ensure the continuation of teaching and learning throughout disruptions and mobilize the expertise and resources needed to digitally transform.

In addition to providing support, the GEC has **three Global Flagship** operations: connectivity of schools and learners, training and development of teachers, and work aiming to overturn gender discrimination in education and make learning more equitable. In addition to ensuring that projects and partners have the data, knowledge, and support required to work effectively, the Coalition is dedicated to helping augment resilience and transformation in education by using technologies to help diminish the digital divide.

The Transforming Education Summit provided a unique opportunity to elevate education including digital transformation to the top of the global political agenda and to mobilize action, ambition, solidarity and solutions to recover pandemic-related learning losses and accelerate achievements of SDG4.

It is for this reason that Coalition members have come together to form the **Digital Transformation**Collaborative (DTC) which will mobilize in-kind and financial resources at national scale with the participation of

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governments wanting to digitally transform their education systems. The DTC will centre on country actions and leverage the resources to be developed through the Gateways to Public Digital Learning, a global, multi-partner initiative to support countries in securing equitable access to digital learning resources.

The Coalition will also continue implementing and scale-up its **four ambitious missions** related to skills, teachers, catch-up learning, and gender. The Coalition members will also continue working together to collect data, advocate and share knowledge regarding education challenges and responses. These missions

Objectives

On **28 March 2023**, the third anniversary of the creation of the Global Education Coalition, UNESCO will invite all 208 members of the Coalition, as well as Member States, to the **very first in-person** meeting at UNESCO headquarters in Paris.

The meeting has the following objectives:

- Inspire innovation and collaboration between Member States and GEC partners
- Solidify the positioning of GEC as a key actor to transform education and respond to crises
- Publicly launch the Digital Transformation Collaborative, a sub-group of GEC members dedicated to designing tailor-made solutions for Member States seeking system-wide scalable and sustainable digital transformation
- Share progress and plans for scale-up of its key missions (Global Skills Academy, Global Teachers Campus, Global Learning House, Gender Flagship)
- Share progress towards the commitments of the Transforming Education Summit, and plans for accelerating efforts towards SDG4 and Agenda 2030.

Format & session logistics

The meeting will take place in-person only.

In the morning, in-person participants will convene in Room I of UNESCO Headquarters at 7 Place de Fontenoy, Paris for high-level sessions. Interpretation in French and English will be provided.

Key messages

- Coalition members are called upon to provide support to teaching and lifelong learning that reaches well beyond the crisis needs of the pandemic.
- Governments can formally request assistance from the Coalition, which can then mobilize and coordinate actions from over 208 institutional partners.
- The Coalition matches needs at the point of education provision with local and global solutions; mobilizes the actors and resources required to develop active responses; coordinates the action to maximize impact and ensure efficiency; and provides remote learning opportunities through a variety of high-, low- and no-tech solutions.

• The Coalition is unique for its speed, efficiency, and its ability to deliver results by leveraging resources normally unavailable due to the lower investment cost needed compared to traditional education development programming.
