# Delivery

## Inclusive and Resilient Societies report 2023

- The top 10 billionaires took 9 months to regain their pre-pandemic wealth while the world's poorest will take 10+ years to recover
- Strong call to reframe the current equity vs. efficiency narrative
- Advocates for an ex-ante integration of equity – in both analysis and policymaking – as a key concern and indicator of success
- Supports a deeply multi-layered (territorially, societally, sectorally) approach to build more inclusive economic frameworks
- First step of a new conceptual framework that will help us build more concrete deliverables





# Delivery

## Partnership with the Groupe d'études géopolitiques (GEG),

- A series of five seminars on “Human Sciences and Social Transformations”.
- Raise visibility of critical work by MOST on key aspects related to trending social issues
- The first seminar on “Decline of social ties – Political sociology” took place last Monday

## Way forward

- 4 other seminars from April to October\*
- Publications in the review *le Grand Continent*

# Growth and development Of the Thought Leadership initiative

## Expansion

- Aggregate and operationalize critical knowledge and work results produced by MOST into the initiative
- In-country policy support through MOST tools
- Assist to create a more inclusive environment for researchers from the Global South

# Delivery and impact

## Digital platform

- UNESCO- and globally-leading platform of its kind
- 4300 members, 2000 experts, and 150 e-teams
- 110 knowledge, policy-oriented products
- Leading figures and top-tier experts

## Policy issues

- 5 curated workstreams on cutting-edge, frontier issues
  - Trust in science, crisis of expertise
  - Sustainable welfare, eco-social policies
  - Data for good (data value, distribution, policy use)
  - Equitable reset
  - Basic income (minimum, temporary, green)



# Insights

## Basic income

- Basic income can't be isolated from the rest of the policy space but treated as part of a system-wide response
- Calibration is key to basic income, with any desired outcome requiring fitted design of schemes and their financing
- Much data on basic income comes from policy trials, yet paths to scale-up (political, technical) demand attention

## Data for good

- Data cultures and investment in data analytics within government is required for use in/for governance
- (New) data needs (old) research skills
- Data value is to be defined comprehensively – monetary, statistical, social – and distributed accordingly



# Delivery and impact

## In-country projects

- Demand-driven, impact-oriented, structured interventions
  - Support shared audits of policies
  - Enhance the flow and the use of knowledge policies
  - Harness new forms of data in policies

## Coverage

- 20 in-country, with 7 being added
- 5 priority priority regions
  - Jakarta cluster (Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines)
  - New Delhi cluster (India)
  - Beijing cluster (Mongolia)
  - Nairobi cluster (Kenya)
  - Europe (2 EU-funded, regional projects)



# Growth and development

## Cooperations and fundraising

- High-potential cooperation with European Commission
- Sustained stream of EX for MOST
- €2.5-3 million, 7 countries, support in-government analytical capacities with robust knowledge-policy links
- Yielding UNESCO-wide results
  - | Inter-sectional project on AI (€600.000)
  - | Inter-sectoral project on education for vulnerable youth

## Expansion

- Migration and growth of the digital platform
- 7 countries added to the on-the-ground network
- Development of cutting-edge models for replication

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### Core strategy

- Advance the inclusive development agenda with Member States through a capability-based approach to futures
- Engage in research and convene experts around Futures Literacy and Foresight and disseminate knowledge through high-profile events, publications and partnerships
- Sustain SHS's position as a key contributor to UNESCO's core function as a laboratory of ideas

### Key points

- Lead UN-wide capacity-building efforts (Foresight Masterclasses, Futures Literacy Laboratories)
- Contribute to the UN Futures Lab as Core Group Network Members
- Contribute substantially to the development of the discipline, strengthening the knowledge-policy nexus

# Futures Literacy & Foresight

## IMPACT ON MOST RESEARCH- POLICY NEXUS

### ”Our Common Agenda”

- Contribute to Our Common Agenda’s pillar on “Duties to the Future”
- Lead institutional capacity building across the UN system to better address wicked problems and celebrate “World Futures Day” (2 December)
- Establish and lead the UN Strategic Foresight Community of Practice
- Produce both research and ready-to-use tools

### Production of knowledge

- Organise tailor made workshops for policy-makers
- Host academic symposia to promote scientific advancement
- Nurture a transdisciplinary dialogue with the 37 UNESCO Chairs (Futures Studies, Anticipation, Futures Literacy and Foresight)
- Launch theoretical and practical publications
- Establish an academic Master’s Programme in Futures Studies



# Futures Literacy & Foresight

## PLANNING

### Key future activities

- Establish and lead the UN Foresight Community of Practice, to advance strategic foresight and futures literacy across the UN ecosystem
- Foster the collaboration with different stakeholders (partnership with the Asian Development Bank to implement futures activities in Asia Pacific Region)
- Engage in a follow-up project to "Imagining Africa's Futures" in collaboration with OCP Foundation and Mohammed VI Polytechnic University in Morocco
- Further nurture the collaboration in the MENA Region (Saudi Arabia, Egypt, UAE, Jordan and more).



# Futures Literacy & Foresight

## PRIORITIES & KNOWLEDGE OUTCOMES

### Priorities & Knowledge Outcomes

- Nurture the capability-based approach to futures with all stakeholders, in particular with policy-makers, in order to navigate complexity and deal successfully with uncertainty
- Launch of the High-Level Working Group on futures and foresight, involving champions as Spain, Singapore and the United Arab Emirates to stimulate peer learning and constant exchange
- Promote the Tools Collection on Futures for Intergenerational Equity Thinking
- Introduce the Futures Literacy Playbook: a guide to designing and implementing a Futures Literacy Laboratory

# Digital Anthropology



## What have we learned about Digital Anthropology?

- Digital Anthropology has accumulated valuable experiences in relevant topics, including health, elections, migration, and combating polarization and misinformation
- “Thicker” insights lead to more inclusive policies, providing visibility and proximity of unaccounted human perspectives
- Digital Anthropology integrates human-centered and data-driven approaches, reducing biases and blind spots in decision-making.
- New potential to formulate an anthropologically informed position to interact with algorithms and intervene in ongoing AI debates

## What opportunities does Digital Anthropology offer?

1. Capitalize on the growing interest in the social and cultural impacts of emerging technology
2. Themes: "Inclusive Digital Societies" and "Digital Media and Social Movements"
3. Digital Anthropology training and capacity building initiatives
4. New UNESCO Chairs in Digital Anthropology, with a focus on the Global South.
5. Promote innovation and experimentation in related fields, such as Digital Humanities and Computational Social Sciences

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# Strategic framework Objectives

## Strategic framework

## Objectives

### Main objectives:

- Know and make known - to the world, but especially to Africans - Africa and its diasporas' contributions to the general progress of humanity, and thus remedy the general ignorance on Africa's history.
- Strengthen Africans' self-confidence, self-esteem, pride, and confidence in their heritage.





# Implementation and Achievements

## Production of knowledge on African History

### 1st Phase

- 8 volumes of the GHA available in whole or in part in 12 languages
- 12 volumes of the Series « GHA: Studies and documents »
- 9 volumes of the sources of African History

### 2nd Phase (2009 - )

- Manuscripts of 3 new volumes of the GHA to:
- *Update the collection*
- *Map and analyze the history of the african diasporas*
- *Analyze the challenge face by the continent*
- *The manuscripts will be available in Chinese, English, French and Portuguese*





# Implementation and Achievements (cont'd)


## Pedagogical use of the GHA

- Development of pedagogical material for use in primary and secondary schools based on 9 learning units covering the history of African for the very begging of Humanity till present time (Kenya, France, and some countries have expressed interest to be part of the pilot countries)

## Dissemination and outreach

- 20 films broadcast on BBC World
- 52 radios programmes aired on RFI
- 50 classic Africanfilms being restored
- 4 documentary films entitled African Empires being produced
- A Serious game of 6 historical figures of the history of Africa and its diaspora being developed

# Challenges



**Educational:** call upon Member States to incorporate the pedagogical material developed into their national curricula



**Financial:** 827 000 US\$ are needed to undertake the remaining editorial work and publish the 3 new volumes
