#5 Getting ready to promote greening schools at COP28

Background

Following the success of the <u>first series of eight monthly conversations on climate change</u> <u>education for social transformation on the road to COP27</u> which gathered 15,000 participants from 184 countries focusing on greening every education policy and curriculum, UNESCO and UNFCCC are launching a second series of six webinars, from May to December 2023, on greening schools on the road to COP28 in Dubai, UAE.

The discussions will focus on how to ensure that all learning institutions, from early childhood through adult education, are climate-ready and integrate a whole-institution approach to ESD to transform their teaching and learning, school facilities and operation, school governance and community engagement.

Similar to the previous series on the road to COP27, this second webinar season is organized in view of the UNESCO global framework on Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) for the

period 2020-2030, entitled 'Education for Sustainable Development: Towards achieving the SDGs (ESD for 2030)', as well as Glasgow work programme on Action for Climate Empowerment (ACE) to promote transformative education to tackle the climate crisis, and feeds into the ACE Hub, an initiative launched by UNFCCC and the German Federal State of North Rhine-Westphalia in 2022 to foster education and public awareness, training, public access to information and participation in climate change action.

Objectives and key questions for webinar #5

Building on the momentum through this series of webinars and the growth of the Greening Education Partnership (GEP), which to date includes over 1100 organizations and 80 Member States, COP28 will be a critical moment to mobilize commitment to concrete action for scaling up education's role to tackle climate change and greening every school.

Encouraged by the vision and leadership of the government of the United Arab Emirates (UAE) in placing education as a priority agenda for COP28, the first historic Education Hub named "Greening Education Hub: LEGACY – from the Land of Zayed", hosted by the UAE Ministry of Education in partnership with the GEP, will be established to highlight and advocate for education's central role in tackling the climate emergency. Building on the previous ministerial sessions at COP26 and COP27, high-level events will be organized at COP28 to bring together political commitments on greening education, including through the joint statement, ministerial session and RewirED summit, among others.

The fifth webinar aims to help participants navigate COP28 by highlighting the importance of greening education to tackle climate change, especially through greening schools.

The session will address the following questions:

- What are your expectations and plans concerning greening schools at COP28? What are
 the key issues and opportunities emerging from this webinar series in promoting
 greening schools that should be reflected in the discussion at COP28?
- How can collaboration be fostered to amplify the key messages and to promote greening schools at COP28 and beyond?
