#### Provisional agenda

The <u>ESD-NET Global Meeting</u> will focus on sharing the implementation and progress of the Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) for 2030 Roadmap and framework, its country initiatives, trends and innovations in the context of Agenda 2030 and the follow-up to the Transforming Education Summit and discuss action points in 2024-2025.

Some key objectives include:

- Demonstrating how ESD for 2030 strengthens the quality and relevance of education in the context of transforming education.
- Developing systemic education responses (national and regional) to current sustainable development challenges under the ESD for 2030 programme, and
- Strengthening multi-stakeholder engagement for the implementation of ESD for 2030 at national and regional level.

## Main expected outcomes:

In addition to the strengthening of ESD-NET's community of practice, key outcomes will include:

- Recommended approaches, strategies and good practices in the implementation of the ESD for 2030 Roadmap and country initiatives, including resources and research findings on ESD, and
- What's next for ESD-NET2030? a draft action plan for regional and global ESD-NET activities over next two years to strengthen collaboration and engagement across member states and partners.

Room: Annex Terrace Interpretation NONE	Priority Action Area 2 calls for transformation of learning environments so that 'learners learn what they live and live what they learn'. But what does this mean in practice and what changes and impacts will we see in education as a result? In this session we will review some ESD programmes and frameworks for transforming learning environments. We will hear from partners who have successfully integrated these processes into their national education systems, including the practical dimensions of this work, challenges encountered, and the results achieved. Finally, during group discussion participants will consider what is possible regarding the transformation of learning environments in their own national context, and what practical steps will be required.

Room: U Thant Conference Hall Interpretation EN/JP	Priority Action Area 3 highlights how critical educators are in realizing the transformational shift in education. Educators need to be empowered and equipped with the knowledge, skills, competencies, values and behaviours required to realize ESD for 2030. The session will hear from partners and member states about different systemic and comprehensive ESD capacity development approaches being undertaken, including examples of peer-to-peer learning, motivation, empowerment, professionalization, support, etc. and with an emphasis on how Ministries, schools, teachers are resp onding to a call to shift from 'teaching' to 'facilitation'.

This session will explore the current barriers to the meaningful inclusion of young people in initiatives that meet ESD for 2030. Intergenerational conversations will be held between young people and stakeholders on how to lessen and/or remove these barriers. These conversations will take place using a structured dialogue designed to encourage participants to critically assess how their projects, programmes, and individual country initiatives can better meet the priority action area of successfully engaging and mobilizing youth.

	ESD is recognized as a key enabler of all 17 SDGs. It is a lifelong learning process and integral to quality education that enhances cognitive, social and emotional and behavioural dimensions of learning. These parallel sessions will approach ESD from specific thematic foci that will highlight how ESD can support societal transformation through learner-centred pedagogy, whole-institution approach, integrated learning content, and empowering all learners to knowledge, skills, competencies, behaviours, attitudes, and values.

Room: Elizabeth Rose Hall Interpretation EN/FR	Early childhood education plays a crucial role in shaping children's attitudes, values, and behaviors towards sustainability and responsible living. The session aims to explore and highlight successful examples of early childhood education for sustainable development, showcasing innovative approaches and initiatives that have made a positive impact. Through a panel discussion format, experts in the field will share their experiences, insights, and practical strategies, providing a comprehensive overview of effective practices that can inspire and guide educators and stakeholders in promoting sustainability.

This requires innovative pedagogical approaches that can help mainstream climate change education in all forms of curricula and education to reach a broad audience. It is critical that we develop tools, methods and approaches that will equip learners with knowledge, skills, attitudes and behaviors towards climate change mitigation, adaptation coupled with the capacity to act towards building a sustainable pathway trajectory for humanity and nature and enable the world to deliver on the 1.5 degrees Celsius commitment towards the Paris Agreement.
