- Strengthening multi-stakeholder engagement for the implementation of ESD for 2030 at national and regional level.

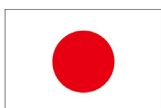
Main expected outcomes:

This session will share critical updates and efforts in implementing policies and guidelines, as well as serve as a platform for MOEs and partner organizations to discuss and exchange innovations and solutions when moving from policy to practice.</p>

But what does this mean in practice and what changes and impacts will we see in education as a result? In this session we will review some ESD programmes and frameworks for transforming learning environments. We will hear from partners who have successfully integrated these processes into their national education systems, including the practical dimensions of this work, challenges encountered, and the results achieved. Finally, during group discussion participants will consider what is possible regarding the transformation of learning environments in their own national context, and what practical steps will be required.</p>

Educators need to be empowered and equipped with the knowledge, skills, competencies, values and behaviours required to realize ESD for 2030. The session will hear from partners and member states about different systemic and comprehensive ESD capacity development approaches being undertaken, including examples of peer-to-peer learning, motivation, empowerment, professionalization, support, etc. and with an emphasis on how Ministries, schools, teachers are responding to a call to shift from ‘teaching’ to ‘facilitation’.</p>

09:30 – 11:00	<p>Session VI: ESD in practice – Parallel thematic sessions on ESD implementation</p> <p><i>ESD is recognized as a key enabler of all 17 SDGs. It is a lifelong learning process and integral to quality education that enhances cognitive, social and emotional and behavioural dimensions of learning. These parallel sessions will approach ESD from specific thematic foci that will highlight how ESD can support societal transformation through learner-centred pedagogy, whole-institution approach, integrated learning content, and empowering all learners to knowledge, skills, competencies, behaviours, attitudes, and values.</i></p>
09:30 – 11:00	<p>Session VI-A: ‘Inspiring sustainable actions in early childhood education’, organized by Fundación EPM and University of Gothenburg</p> <p><i>Early childhood education plays a crucial role in shaping children's attitudes, values, and behaviors towards sustainability and responsible living. The session aims to explore and highlight successful examples of early childhood education for sustainable development, showcasing innovative approaches and initiatives that have made a positive impact. Through a panel discussion format, experts in the field will share their experiences, insights, and practical strategies, providing a comprehensive overview of effective practices that can inspire and guide educators and stakeholders in promoting sustainability.</i></p>

This requires innovative pedagogical approaches that can help mainstream climate change education in all forms of curricula and education to reach a broad audience. It is critical that we develop tools, methods and approaches that will equip learners with knowledge, skills, attitudes and behaviors towards climate change mitigation, adaptation coupled with the capacity to act towards building a sustainable pathway trajectory for humanity and nature and enable the world to deliver on the 1.5 degrees Celsius commitment towards the Paris Agreement.
